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#### Field Trips

### **Nassau County Courthouse**

During this field trip, students got the opportunity to visit and explore the Nassau County Courthouse. The courthouse allowed the students to realize a lot of what they had been learning in class, from voir dire to trial. The students toured the courthouse, observing and reading on the exhibitions. Afterwards, they received an educational lesson about the importance of jury duty.





#### **Duane Morris LLP**

Our field trip to Duane Morris exposed the students to corporate law and work-life balance. The students were warmly welcomed by the managing partner who told a motivating story about his journey to law today. As pizza was served, the students had a lunch and learn as they listened to the compelling and inspiring stories of the attorneys.

### Workday

During our trip to Workday, our students learned and activated their knowledge through creativity. Students first learned about online safety and data breeches. Next, students learned about contract, then were able negotiate their own contracts for an activity. Finally, they were able to go to the top of the Empire State building alongside Workday attorneys. Our students brought their passion and creativity to the activities and learned a lot.



# **Mock Trial: Prosecution v. Defense**

Students engaged with the knowledge they've learned over the summer through the Mock Trial competition. Inspired by "the slap heard around the world," our case this year was *State v. Smythe*. In this case, Mr. Bill Smythe has been charged with Assault in the Third Degree and Disorderly Conduct after Bill Smythe slapped Rick Stone on live television for cracking disrespectful jokes of his wife, Jamie Blue Smythe. The case expanded on the source material in order to be trickier for both sides to argue, including adding elements where the Rick Stone character was acting in an intimidating manner towards Ms. Blue Smythe and adding in that the Bill Smythe character continued aggressively disrupting the night's activities after the slap.

The prosecution presented their case, arguing that Mr. Stone was brutally assaulted by Mr. Smythe for no reason and attempted to reject Smythe's self-defense claim by arguing that there was no immediate threat. Defense countered this argument by claiming that as Rick Stone was walking towards the two to apologize, the Smythe's saw it as a threat to physically hurt Jamie, and that Mr. Stone had menacingly stalked over to them with a trophy in hand. The defense's argument hinged on the idea Bill Smythe saw this as a threat and thought that Mr. Stone would try to hurt his wife. During the Finals of the competition, Prosecution and Defense passionately presented their arguments in front of the honorable Judge John Lansden of the New York State Court of Appeals, who gave a verdict of Guilty.
